Today's Choir Anthem

Wake Every Breath by William Billings (1746-1800)

William Billings was born in Boston and is regarded as the first American professional choral composer. He was involved in teaching singing throughout his life and established the first singing school in Boston which later became the first music school in the USA. Billings had several teaching positions, which he carried out at various churches. He organized the first church choir in America at Old South Church in Boston and served as its choir director.

Mission of the Month

Rough Edges **Saint John's Darlinghurst**



Saint John's Anglican Church, Darlinghurst is in a strategic location to reach out with innovative ministries to the many homeless people of East Sydney. St John's Community Services offers positive, community experiences through a range of programs including **Rough Edges**.

Rough Edges is a drop-in centre running six nights a week providing meals and community to those experiencing homelessness. Since 2016, Rough Edges has been serving more than 13,000 meals each year. In 2021, it provided nearly 3,000 appointments with a social worker. The Centre also runs a range of other services ranging from new skills courses to legal aid to chaplaincy services. VALE BISHOP ARTHUR MALCOLM

Bishop Arthur Malcolm was Australia's first Aboriginal Bishop and an outstanding leader and pastor in the Australian church. Bishop Arthur retired from his episcopal role in 2001 but has continued to inspire and encourage from his home in Yarrabah, North Queensland.

Bishop Malcolm was born at Yarrabah and began training as a Church Army Officer in Stockton (New South Wales) where he completed a Certificate course in Evangelism in 1959. During his time as a Captain in the Church Army he served at Lake Tyers (Victoria) and Brewarrina (New South Wales). People from Victoria and New South Wales express great affection for their beloved "Captain".

He returned to Yarrabah in 1974 as Chaplain and was ordained by the Bishop of North Queensland in 1978. As well as ministering to his people at Yarrabah he had responsibility for Anglican people at Palm Island. He was made a Canon of St James' Cathedral, Townsville in 1984 and consecrated Bishop with special responsibility to Aboriginal people in 1985.

During this time he developed an outstanding leadership amongst Aboriginal people and encouraged them in their education, community life and in the many struggles which Indigenous people in Australia encounter.

He has also been engaged in leadership and pastoral support in the non-Indigenous community and is well respected and admired for his sensitive and reconciling counsel.

Arthur Malcolm had great involvement in the ecumenical community and was foundation Chair of the Aboriginal and Islander Commission of the National Council of Churches in Australia. In 1992 he and Aboriginal members of the Anglican church of Australia met together and formed the body which became known as NATSIAC (National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglican Council). Arthur Malcolm was elected as the first Chairperson.

Bishop Arthur Malcolm has made an extraordinary contribution to the Anglican Church of Australia. His committed leadership and his faithfulness to the Gospel of Christ, devotion to the wellbeing of all Aboriginal people in Australia and unstinting service to his church are gifts which we have treasured and which we honour. Along with his wife, Coleen, Bishop Arthur wrote the Reconciliation Prayer which appears in *A Prayer Book for Australia*, page 203.

Archbishop Kanishka Raffel has paid tribute to Australia's first Indigenous Bishop, Arthur Malcolm, who has passed away at the age of 87..... His influence and ministry led to the public apology from the Anglican Church to Aboriginal people in 1988. At St Andrew's Cathedral in Sydney, Australian Anglican Bishops led by the [then] Primate, Sir John Grindrod, delivered an apology to Bishop Malcolm. Archbishop Raffel called Bishop Malcolm's passing 'a great sadness' and recalled his pioneering ministry.

"His historic leadership of Indigenous Christians, pointing us all to an everlasting homeland, paved the way for generations to follow," the Archbishop said. "We express our condolences to his family and his people and thank God for his example of gracious, humble and faithful service. Home with the Lord."
