Lighting a candle at St Alban's

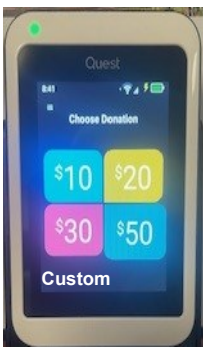
The Pastoral Care Committee have organised cards (next to the votive candles) to send to loved ones in need.
