#### Ross' Letter

This will be my last Bulletin letter, ending my seven years as Rector of St Alban's. That seven years has gone incredibly fast. It has been a time of ups and downs for all of us. Right in the middle we had the crazy world of Covid with all that dislocation and uncertainty brought with it.

Normally in a last sermon the preacher will pick their favourite passage or reflect on a favourite topic. I decided that I would not do that but rather let the Lectionary writers set the readings for this final sermon. I had looked at the passages a couple of months ago just to see if that would be a wise course of action. But what more wonderful words could we reflect upon than these from the gospel of John:

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love." John 15:9

Or these from his first letter:

"Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christhas been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child." 1 John 5:1

In these passages we see John address the topic of biblical love. Our modern world has a very different idea of what love is, that conforms to the individualistic, consumer culture of our society. But the Bible picture of love is of self-sacrifice modelled on the example of Jesus:

"No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." John 15:13

This love goes even further by calling on the follower of Jesus to emulate that love: "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." John 5:12

That Jesus commands us to love is also at odds with our culture, that considers any form of command an unwarranted compulsion that limits our freedom. This is another difference between the emotionally driven love of our world and the volitional character of biblical love. This command of God is not burdensome because in this love we see a faith that has conquered the world.

If we as a church truly love one another in this way, we will take our community by surprise and be able to point them to the One who makes such a life possible.



#### **Postage Stamps**
