Advent and the Advent Wreath

We celebrate the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent and look forward to the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent.

Changes in the Service: During Advent reflecting the penitential nature of the season there are changes in the liturgy: the Gloria is omitted, and the Confession and Absolution are in a different place. We kneel (or sit) for The Great Thanksgiving, and we are invited to kneel (where this is possible) to receive communion, so that at Christmas we can stand to celebrate the coming of the Christ Child.

Advent Wreath: Each Sunday in Advent is marked by lighting a new candle on the circular Advent Wreath of five candles. This Sunday we light the fourth candle which represents peace and is called the "Angels' Candle." The angels announced that Jesus came to bring peace - peace with God and peace to our world. The fifth candle represents light and purity and is called the "Christ Candle." It is placed in the middle and is lit late on Christmas Eve or on Christmas Day.

In our world and our Country pray for peace and harmony - may we find the love of God and the message of Christ reflected in our communities; may we see each other as neighbours not enemies. Pray for God's grace to surround and uphold the grieving; the refugees; the marginalised; those without hope, and those who work to alleviate the suffering of others. May we seize the opportunities to spread the message of hope, joy, and love. Pray for our beautiful land, all the people who dwell in it, that we may cherish the diversity of people here representing the races of the world.

In our community and Families pray that families may enjoy time together over Christmas, and pray for those who for various reasons will be separated from family at this time. Pray for those who are sick in mind, body or spirit and give strength to those who care for them. May our families, friends and strangers see Christ reflected in us this Christmas.

For Christmastide: God for whom we watch and wait, you sent John the Baptist to prepare the way for your Son: give us courage to speak the truth, to hunger for justice, and to suffer for the cause of right, that at your second coming to judge the world we may be found an acceptable people in your sight; for you are alive and reign with the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen
