## Rector's Letter

Most of us are probably familiar with that old aphorism that says 'experience is a great teacher'. But there are two ways we can learn, from our own experience or the experience of others. The reason this is so, is because there are two types of teachers in this world that God has created, the Teacher of Wisdom and the Teacher of Consequences.

Over the next five weeks we are going to explore the experience of a number of heroes of the Bible. But what we will see is that each of these heroes has major character flaws that would suggest that God could not use them. Yet this series is not about your flaws but God's faithfulness.

Abraham is known as the Father of Faith (Romans 4:16) and yet if we follow his story through the book of Genesis, we see that he makes a number of stumbles along the way. On two occasions his deception almost brought disaster on innocent parties. Rather than relying on the promise of God for a child to Sarah his wife, he follows her suggestion to sleep with her maidservant Hagar.

Abraham is fearful, he watches his own back, he makes his own plans, he lets his wife talk him into a bad choice. You could say Abraham is just like you and me. But what we learn is that for all his failures, God is the one who accepts and changes him. The Apostle Paul wrote of Abraham;

"He did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God," Romans 4:20 NIV

The lesson for us lies in this statement that Abraham 'was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God'. Notice the passive nature of that word, Abraham was strengthened. It wasn't Abraham that was doing the strengthening, it was God.

If our hope lay in what we do for God, then our regular failures would bar us from friendship with him. But it is faith, our trust in his promises, that opens the gate to forgiveness and salvation. Our flaws will always cause us to doubt our standing with God. But if we, like Abraham, trust in the faithfulness of God we can have that full assurance of the acceptance of God.
