Mission of the Month Act for Peace

Act for Peace is the international aid agency of the National Council of Churches in Australia. As part of the ACT Alliance, Act for Peace works with local organisations around the world, saving lives when disaster strikes and helping to build long-term change.

Today there are more than **123.2 million people displaced** due to conflict and disaster, more than at any other time in history. During 2023/2024 Act for Peace assisted 15 local partners in 16 countries in the funding of 26 programs, improving the lives of 142,758 people.
