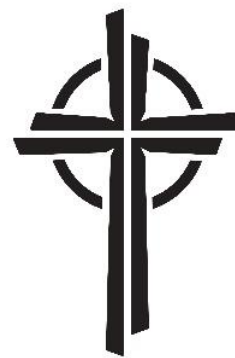

Please join with members of parishes across Sydney and ABM supporters as we host this service and lunch. The Martyrs were clergy, teachers, and medical staff serving as missionaries who were killed as they attempted to stay with the people they had been serving as the war came to New Guinea. The story of the New Guinea Martyrs is a living witness to faith, courage and the call for peace. Here at St Alban's we feel a close association as two of the Martyrs were parishioners here for a time; we honour them in our Martyrs' Chapel, and in a window on the northern wall, and more recently in the acceptance of a 'Reconciliation Necklace' - the story of which is told in the Chapel.

During or after the Service you will be able to contribute to the Martyrs Gift 2026, honouring the memory of the Martyrs through the Martyrs Gift – supporting education, strong leadership and brighter futures for our neighbours in Papua New Guinea.

Living Water
Season of Creation 2026

Immersion in Living Water
EZEKIEL 47:9, 12

This year's theme, "Living Water", reminds us of God's life-giving presence and our shared calling to care for the earth and all who depend on it. Inspired by Ezekiel's vision of the river that brings healing wherever it flows, we're invited to immerse ourselves in God's renewing work and become streams of hope in our communities.

Synod of the Diocese of Sydney

The Synod is the annual gathering of representatives of the churches of the Diocese with the Archbishop. The Synod meets to consider matters affecting the order and good government of the Diocese. It has been doing so since 1866!

At present there are 800 members of the Synod. The membership is broadly divided into two "houses", being clergy and laity. A new Synod is elected every three years. Usually clergy and laity vote on matters together, but there is provision for clergy and laity to vote separately, in order to establish agreement of "both houses" to a matter.

Synod in 2026 will meet on Monday 14, Tuesday 15, Wednesday 16, Monday 21 and Tuesday 22 September 2026.

Our Synod representatives are our Rector, and two lay members of the parish - Doris Awad and Gillian Taylor, who will attend sessions when they are able.

Pray for the Archbishop, clergy, and lay representatives gathering for the 54th Synod. Ask God to grant them wisdom, patience, and clear discernment as they discuss motions, governance, and the future direction of the diocese.

Thoughts and Prayers for Reflection for September 2026 is now available and is produced within the parish with a thought and prayer for each day of the month, as well as weekly prayers. The October prayers will be available at the end of September.

Memorial Garden

The Memorial Garden at St Alban's was established in 1981 as a sacred place of remembrance for members of our Parish community whose ashes have been scattered there. It continues to hold deep significance for many in our community.

Following a wider Diocesan review of graveyards, columbaria and memorial gardens, we have been advised that no further interment of ashes is to take place in the garden. This review is intended to ensure that all such places comply with current state government legislation, including the registration of historic and existing sites.

The Rector and Wardens are very mindful of the pastoral sensitivities surrounding this change, particularly for families who have loved ones remembered in the garden. We recognise that there are a small number of people in the Parish who are surviving spouses of those whose ashes have been interred there. The Diocese has granted discretion for a limited number of further interments in the case of surviving spouses and in exceptional circumstances. Those surviving spouses have been contacted individually to explain the change and the discretion that has been approved.

The garden will continue to be honoured and cared for as a memorial garden, and the register of those interred there will continue to be maintained.

If you have any concerns or questions about this decision, please speak with the Rector or one of the Wardens.

Mission of the Month in September Church Missionary Society

The mission of the Church Missionary Society (CMS) is to reach 'gospel-poor' peoples for Christ, to equip Christians as leaders in the church and the world, and to engage churches in **cross-cultural mission**. Currently CMS partners with over 80 organisations in gospel ministry in almost 50 countries. Hundreds of churches in Australia are engaged in cross-cultural mission through CMS.

On Saturday 6 June, Saint Alban's hosted the recommissioning of CMS missionary **Julie** to return to South East Asia for her second term. Pastor Kian Holik (EPIC) in his sermon very much encouraged Julie and her six supporting churches, represented by about sixty people at the service.

As Julie states, serving in South East Asia while 'stepping into another culture has shown me the power of God's loving presence. *I have seen it in the lives of new friends, as God draws many to depend upon him and the grace that he offers.*' For further insights into Julie's mission, please refer to cms.org.au/missionaries/jusn/#. Mission of the Month in October Banksia Women and Rough Edges Saint John's Darlinghurst



Saint John's Anglican Church, Darlinghurst is in a strategic location to reach out with innovative ministries to the people of East Sydney. **Saint John's Community Services (SJCS)**, a registered charity, was commenced in 1996 by Saint John's as an outreach program for homeless people coming through the doors of their drop-in centre Rough Edges.

SJCS offers *Help, Home and Hope* to those suffering from the trauma of homelessness, domestic violence and exclusion.
